#### CHAIRMAN'S REPORT FOR THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THURSDAY 26 SEPTEMBER 2013

The twelve months since the last AGM has been consumed largely with planning for the future while maintaining the operational capacity of the Centre.

One of the first measures was to make some management changes to enable new activities to be established together with increased marketing of those activities through a website and social media.

We also ventured into the 'events' arena with a stunningly successful Community Art Exhibition which resulted in visitors, exhibitors and sponsors crying for more.

As usual some regulars have moved out which enabled us to welcome new groups and maintain our occupancy rate at 74%.

The Early Learning Centre received a very positive ERO report, although the time taken to perform the work necessary in preparation for the review meant we lost some income.

A significant problem arose when we were informed that we had problems with the cladding of the building and as a result we are now engaged in fundraising to continue detailed planning and design to enable the necessary recladding to be done.

We are planning to renovate the mission Hall in time for its centenary on 4 September 2015 and have had protracted communication with the Methodist Church to discuss a process where the Centre might add the Hall to our lease which has 47 years to run.

We were subsequently approached by the Kaipatiki Local Board with a proposal that we discuss options for becoming part of a civic centre for Glenfield. The Governance Group recently formally agreed to pursue this opportunity subject to conditions.

Meanwhile discussions are also on-going regarding the possible acquisition of the freehold of the land on which the Centre stands.

In short, a busy, fulfilling, year at times frustrating year.

We acknowledge the support we receive from the Kaipatiki Local Board towards our operating costs, and from members of the business community for the sponsorship of some of our activities.

Throughout the year we have been well served by our excellent staff who all work well to make the Centre hum as a welcoming focal point for the community.

My thanks to all the staff and to our busy Executive and members of the Governance Group for their service through the year.

#### MANAGEMENT REPORT FOR THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THURSDAY 26 SEPTEMBER 2013

Increase has been the catchword of this year. We have seen a 5% increase in the number of people using the centre and a 12% increase in the number of community group bookings. These increases have generated over \$10,000 more income from room hire than last year.

The Management Team has placed a greater emphasis on Community Development and the firming up of external partnerships to ensure community needs are heard.

In line with this we have started to promote and run some activity groups: a Friendship Group, a Business Network, and our Community Knitters, who have been making blankets for distribution through local community agencies, a total of 81 blankets given out so far. The knitting was featured in an article in the North Shore Times and attracted a lot of interest; we now have many housebound women supplying squares for our community blankets, along with the 20 or so that meet on a Friday morning. As the weather becomes warmer they plan to start knitting toys for Christmas.

Throughout the year we have received support from The Lion Foundation, Bayer New Zealand, Just Do it Trust, Four Winds Foundation, Trillian Trust, Timberworld Birkdale, McDonald's Glenfield, Subway Glenfield, Countdown Bentley Ave, Banx Systems, Z Energy, Daniel Shotter Graphic Design, Phil Mitchell – Harcourts Glenfield, The Kefir Company, Glenfield Plumbing, Ministry of Education, Ministry of Social Development, Auckland Council and the Kaipatiki Local Board. This support has been greatly appreciated and enabled us to purchase new chairs, tables and whiteboards for our meeting rooms, new trellis and flowerpots for our courtyard. These sponsors have also contributed to our upcoming Art Exhibition, which will create a positive community event.

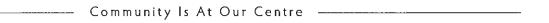
In November we joined the Glenfield Santa Parade, our float was a white winter theme with a snowman and candy canes. A team of ten volunteers, led by Marg distributed magnets and lollies from High Road to Marlborough Park.

In March we held a successful Neighbours Day, with many requests for us to offer more opportunities for the community to meet socially.

We have also been working hard to promote the centre to the wider community by tapping into social media and have been able to increase our promotional advertising, newsletters, roadside flags and have even been on Chinese TV.

Looking ahead we will be continuing to offer a quality facility for community use, ensuring that it is a well utilised and active centre of the Glenfield area.

#### **GLENFIELD EARLY LEARNING CENTRE**

#### **ANNUAL REPORT 2013**

The Glenfield Early Learning Centre [GELC] have had positive confirmation, through the Education Review Office (ERO), that we continue to offer experiences which enrich children's lives and provide them with the knowledge, skills, and dispositions they need to tackle new challenges. The curriculum reflects our philosophy and established relationships play a significant role in laying foundations for successful learning.

The Ministry of Education completed a Re-Licensing and Certification of the GELC. We were required to complete and show compliance with the EC/1C documentation. It has been a very long time since we have been required to undergo re-licensing so the positive outcome was satisfying. Our new Certificate of Licence will be issued as soon as one area regarding Council documentation is cleared away.

This year has seen the development of a monthly GELC Executive committee. Involving both Governance and management in establishing purposes, processes and issues that determine the quality of the service allows for the development of future action and commitment to the importance and value of review.

This year in particular we have sustained a decrease in revenue. Many ECC centres have also walked a tightrope in trying to both maintain high quality, and cover rising costs with falling income. Increased competition means we have to work very hard at filling child places, we lost funding for support grants for provisionally registered teachers, MOE funding subsidies aren't keeping up with inflation and compliance, the Government decreasing the maximum funding from 100% qualified teachers to the amount set for 80% gives no possibility of a higher rate of funding. The increase of this funding for this year will be 07c per hour. This year balancing income and costs will be a high priority of focus for the centre.

This year the MOE has rolled out the Early Learning Information (ELI), enabling the Government to collect and store information on children's identity and participation. They allocate each child a national student number that will follow them through education and allow the MOE to data-share with other agencies and aggregate individual achievement information.

The GELC have been very committed to exploring opportunities for the families to attend, participate and open the learning and fun that takes place. Our functions have been successful and we will continue to offer opportunities to whanau.

Finally, I would like to recognise and acknowledge the fine team of teachers who ensure that the centre flourishes and provides the talent, warmth and welcome to our community users. Also I would like to recognise the involvement and support of the GELC executive committee who together are making a difference to the wider understanding of GELC goals.

### GLENFIELD COMMUNITY CENTRE ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2013

#### Note 1: Statement of Accounting Policies

#### Measurement Base

The measurement method is historical cost. Reliance has been placed on the fact that the Glenfield Community Centre is a going concern. Accrual accounting is used to match expenses and revenues.

#### **Differential Reporting**

The Community Centre is a qualifying entity under the framework for differential reporting issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of New Zealand. As at balance date the entity has no public accountability and was also considered not large, the entity has taken advantage of the reporting exemptions available within the Differential Reporting Framework.

#### **Taxation**

Glenfield Community Centre is a charitable organisation registered with the Charities Commission (CC22509) and is exempt from income tax.

#### Particular Accounting Policies.

#### **Accounts Receivable**

Accounts Receivables are shown at their expected realisable value.

#### **Fixed Assets**

Fixed Assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

## Glenfield Community Centre

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 June 2013

We have audited the financial statements on pages 1 to 8, being the statements of financial performance, movements in equity, financial position, notes and accounting policies. The financial statements provide information about the past financial performance of Glenfield Community Centre and its financial position as at 30 June2013. This information is stated in accordance with the accounting policies set out on pages 5 - 6.

#### Responsibilities of the Governance Board

The Board are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements which fairly reflects the financial position of the Glenfield Community Centres at 30 June 2013 and the results of its operations for the year ended 30 June 2013.

#### Auditor's responsibilities

It is our responsibility to express an independent opinion on the financial statements presented by the management committee, and to report our opinion to you.

We conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted international auditing standards in New Zealand. On this basis, an audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making the risk assessments, the auditor considers internal controls, relevant to the organisations preparation of the financial statements, in order to design audit procedures, which are appropriate for the circumstances, but not specifically for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the entity's internal control.

#### **Basis of a Qualified Opinion**

We obtained sufficient and adequate audit evidence, to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatements, except that our audit work has been limited in the verifying of SHP Fees & Trips, and fundraising income, received in cash. In forming our opinion, we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in these financial statements.

Other than in our capacity as auditors, we have no other relationship with or interests in the Glenfield Community Centre.

#### **Opinion**

As is common with organisations of this nature, control over cash income included in the SHP Fee & Trip income of \$12,115, and fundraising income of \$1,798 is limited, and there are no practical audit procedures to determine the effect of this limited control.

Except for the above, we have obtained all the other information and explanations we have required.

In our opinion:

- except for any adjustments to SHP Fees & Trips, and fundraising income, had we obtained sufficient information on these sources of income received in cash,
- the financial statements on pages 1 to 8, in all material aspects give a true and fair view of the financial position of Glenfield Community Centre as at 30 June 2013, and of the results of its operations, for the year ended on that date.

Our audit was completed on the 19<sup>th</sup>September 2013, and our qualified opinion is expressed as at that date.
